Second man convicted in beating death

Plea agreement reduces charge to voluntary manslaughter

The second man charged in the brutal beating death of a Lynchburg man in June pleaded guilty and was convicted of voluntary manslaugher. The day.

Carlton Hunter, 23, of Rustburg, was originally charged with first-degree murder for the death of Daniel Keith Jackson, 39, on June 9. He was scheduled to face a jury trial March 15.

The plea agreement made with p os ecutors, however, did not specify a prison sentence. Hunter faces one to 10 years in prison for the charge, and will be sentenced April 22.

The charge stems from an incident that happened June 9, when Jackson held a birthday party at his house on Pierce Street.

According to prosecutors, codefendant Mario Scott, 23, had asked Jackson to hold onto his handgun while he left the party for a period of time. When Scott returned, he learned that Jackson had given the gun to someone else.

Scott became enraged and punched a tope tin the wall, Lynchburg Deputy Commonwealth's Attorney Chuck Felmlee said.

Jackson began to walk away, toward the front door. That's when Hunter, who had been tranking beer
