

Man gets life without parole

City man had faced death penalty before plea in shotgun killing

A Lynchburg man pleaded guilty to capital murder Monday for what the prosecution said was his role in the shotgun killing of another man last summer.

Circuit Judge Mosby Perrow sentenced Carson Alfred Washington, 29, to life in prison on the capital murder charge and 200 additional years on other charges stemming from the incident.

Washington entered Alford pleas on Monday, which means he maintains his innocence but admits there's enough evidence to

convict him.

Washington was scheduled for a jury trial later this month and was facing the death penalty.

Deputy Commonwealth's Attorney Chuck Felmlee said had the case gone to trial the prosecution would have shown that three men entered the Early Street home of David

Devin Poe, 26, around 11:30 p.m. June 11.

Felmlee said Washington and another man, Garlon Deshawn Cabler, were masked and carrying shotguns as they came into the bedroom Poe shared with his fiancée Danielle Parrish.
