Pierce Street murder case ends in conviction



Mario Antwane Scott didn't beat up Daniel Keith Jackson just once. He came back two more times to kick, pummel and beat the Lynchburg man to death with a vacuum cleaner last June, a prosecutor said Tuesday.

Scott, 23, of Lynchburg was convicted Tuesday of second-degree murder and sentenced to 21 years in prison. He entered an Alford plea, which is where a defendant doesn't admit guilt, but acknowledges that there is enough evidence to convict him.

of an agreement reached with prosecutors. Scott was scheduled to face a jury trial on the charge of firstdegree murder March 15.

The incident happened in the early-morning hours of June 9, Felmlee told Lynchburg Circuit The plea and sentence were part Judge Mosby Perrow, when

Jackson, 39, threw a birthday party for himself at his 1013 Pierce St. home.

Scott asked Jackson to hold his handgun for him while he left the party for a short time. When Scott returned, he learned that Jackson had given his handgun to someone else, Felmlee said.

"This enraged the defendant and he punched a hole in the wall," Felmlee said.

Codefendant Carlton Hunter, 22, of Rustburg, then kicked Jackson in the chest and punched him the jaw, he said.

After that, Scott began repeatedly kicking and punching him in the head. Felmlee said.

Other (cople at the party then

pushed Scott and Hunter out the door, but Scott kicked the door so hard he broke the hinge and came back in. Felmlee said.

That's when Scott took a vacuum cleaner from the front porch and began beating Jackson as he lay face down on the floor, Felmlee said.

Again, Scott was forced out of the residence, but he returned for a third time and again, assaulted Jackson.

"When (police) arrived at 1:36 a.m., Jackson was still alive. He was making a gurgling noise and was taken to the hospital," Felmlee said.

Jackson died a few hours later. Scott and Hunter were charged and arrested several days later at a
