Judge gives shooter 53 years

Pulley called ringleader in robbery that left clerk brain damaged

A Lynchburg man convicted of robbing and shooting a gas station clerk in April will be at least 65 years old before he's eligible to be released from prison, according to a sentence handed down Friday afternoon.

Kionne Pulley, 20, earlier pleaded guilty to aggravated malicious wounding, robbery, wearing a mask in public and two counts of use of a firearm in commission of a felony.

Judge Mosby Perrow sentenced him to an active sentence of 53 years. Under Virginia law, he'll have to serve at least 85 percent of that sentence.

Deputy Commonwealth's Attorney Chuck Felmler said Pulley was the ringleader in the April 24 robbery of the Citgo on Campbell Avenue in which 37-year-old Abderrahin Elfilali was shot in the head.
