

City man pleads guilty, gets 8 years

Convicted of three felony offenses in January shooting

A Lynchburg man will spend eight years in prison for shooting a man in January after an argument with the man's brother.

Bryan O'Neil Cashwell, 31, pleaded guilty in Lynchburg Circuit Court on Monday

morning to charges of malicious wounding, use of a firearm in the commission of a felony and possession of a firearm by a convicted felon, for the shooting of Juaning Stewart, said Deputy Commonwealth's Attorney Chuck Felmlee.

"There was a significant amount of witness intimidation associated with this case," Felmlee said. "This resolution secures a significant penitentiary sentence and makes Lynchburg a safer place by
