

Man faces up to 13 years for April hit-and-run

Campbell County man pleads guilty to DUI maiming and several related offenses

A Campbell County man police said was under the influence of several drugs when his car crashed into another vehicle on Wards Road, injuring two people, pleaded guilty Friday to hit and run, DUI maiming and several related offenses.

Anderson had been scheduled for trial next week but pleaded out Friday, court records show.

Anderson pleaded guilty in Lynchburg Circuit Court to

ceration for a total of five offenses, according to Chuck Felmlee, chief deputy commonwealth's attorney for Lynchburg.

Anderson has been jailed since his arrest April 23 and will remain there until his sentencing at 9 a.m. Jan. 18, Felmlee said in an email.

The charges against Anderson followed an incident April 23 at 10 a.m. when, according to police, his vehicle slammed

hit and run and DUI maiming (both felonies) and DUI-second offense within a five-year period, driving on a suspended license and possession of marijuana, which are misdemeanors.
