

Forest man gets 60 days in jail, \$1,000 fine on peeping charge

A Forest man pleaded guilty Thursday to a charge of peering into the first-floor apartment of two female Lynchburg College students.

Judge F. Patrick Yeatts sentenced Kerry Lamont Fields, 37, to 60 days in jail and a \$1,000 fine on a charge of peeping into an occupied dwelling, said Lynchburg Deputy Commonwealth's Attorney Chuck Felmlee.

Fields must perform 100 hours of community service and have a curfew for the next six months that requires him to be home from 9 p.m. to 6 a.m.
